# **OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AWARDS**

Contest Period 1/1/16 – 12/31/16

The Occupational Safety Contest uses the total OSHA recordable incidence rate to determine the contest winners. The incidence rate is determined by multiplying the total number of OSHA recordable cases by 200,000 and dividing by the number of employee hours the company worked during the calendar year. The average of the 33 participating companies/locations for the contest period of the calendar year of 2016 contest is 1.09. The most recent edition of the National Safety Council *Injury Facts* indicates the total recordable case incidence rate for all industries was 3.3.

Participants in our Occupational Safety Contest were divided into categories by the number of hours worked. The participating company with the best (lowest) incidence rate in each category, but under the average of the participants for that year, will receive the Award of Honor. Those with rates between the lowest and average in each category range will receive the Award of Merit. A Certificate of Participation will be given to those with incidence rates over the average of the participating companies.

# **FLEET SAFETY AWARDS**

Contest Period 1/1/16 – 12/31/16

The frequency rate is used in the Fleet Contest. The frequency rate is determined by multiplying the number of recordable cases by 1,000,000 and dividing by the number of miles operated by the fleet during the calendar year.

Participants in the Fleet Contest were divided into two categories: Passenger Vehicles (cars, vans & pickup trucks) and Trucks (which includes everything else). Each category was then divided into divisions by ranges of miles driven. The participating company with the best (lowest) frequency rate for each category, but under the average, will receive the Award of Honor. Those with rates between the lowest and the average in each category range will receive an Award of Merit. A Certificate of Participation will be given to those with frequency rates over the average.

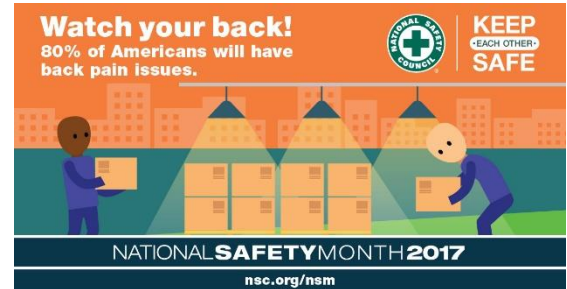
