REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS

The Code of Federal Regulation for General Industry, CFR 1910.1030 requires employees with occupational exposure be trained, equipped and protected. "Occupational Exposure means reasonably anticipated skin, eye, mucous membrane, or parenteral contact with blood or other potentially infectious materials that may result from the performance of an employee's duties." Employers must train such employees annually.

IS YOUR COMPANY PREPARED?

National Safety Council's 2-Hour Bloodborne & Airborne Pathogens Course helps employers meet the required annual training requirement CFR 1910.1030(g)(2). Add your company's exposure control plan details to be fully compliant. A sample exposure control plan included in the student workbook, along with an incident report form, declination form, sharps log and training record log.
